With our hope being to educate families, and give them the instruction and tools needed to implement Montessori methods at home. Some of the areas we want to dive deeper in are:

Academic Education

Current changes being made to the schooling system both globally and locally, along with improvements that can be made. We hope to take deep dives into the research of various trends we are noticing as educators, and solutions that get to the core of the challenges we are seeing.

Parent Involvement

Now more than ever we are seeing a generation of children missing out on this. Life is busy for many families and the reality of a nuclear family is not always the case. By drawing attention to this and providing alternatives we wish to see children thriving and a decrease in the high rates of obesity and non-communicable diseases.

Connecting the Family

Bridging the gap between parents & professionals when it comes to what to do post-diagnosis. Facilitating a resource hub that holds information about schools, therapists, specialists and recreational programs for families with children who have special needs.





Back-to-Basics

These programs will offer guidance on nutrition, ground to table eating, building kitchen gardens, the benefits of healthy meals, especially breakfast as it relates to the child's ability to learn, the importance of family time as opposed to screen time as well as how valuable it is to care for our own mental health and teach our children how to do the same.

Mindfulness & Mental Health

Teaching families more about the impacts of their mental health status on their children. Providing various resources and tools to help families cope with challenging home-life situations and create safe spaces that families can come together to share.

Nutrition & Movement

Extended events that target specific nutrition and movement related goals.

Opening up the MSB library for storytime events for young children and their parents, creating opportunities for children to be read to as well as teaching parents how to encourage and promote literacy at home.

Family Support Groups

Providing a safe space where parents can come together to share experiences and learn from others. Especially for those who have children who have learning or developmental delays or challenges.

This would be offered to those families of Montessori School Barbados as well as in the neighbouring communities.

Sponsoring a child within our community who might be unable to meet the financial requirements of attending MSB but who would greatly benefit from the Montessori method of education, is another fundamental goal of our organisation. Through sponsorship from kind individuals, we hope to assist 1 family in each of our three primary levels with financial aid so that these children can also receive the benefits of this holistic way of education.

WeeCARE will assist in the following areas:

• subsidizing or covering the cost of school fees for families who need financial assistance.

• filling the gaps for the costs of Learning Support Staff who will be working with children in the environment who are on the autism spectrum. Presently in schools, this cost is the responsibility of the families who are already inundated with expenses relating to their child's various therapies.

BUDDY PROGRAM

In creating our buddy program we are going to pair older students with younger children in the community for fun projects as a meaningful after school activity. The primary focus for this will be to have our children outdoors, moving, getting creative, and having wholesome fun in a safe and encouraging environment.

VILLAGE READING NOOKS

We plan to work with our students to map out creative fundraising efforts to be able to fund the purchase of books and resources needed to set up library 'corners' in various neighborhoods and communities around the island. In these reading nooks we also want to provide programs that encourage reading and literacy growth in our youth.

O3 HAMPERS FOR KIDS

Taking time to build hampers with our students for those in the community. Being mindful to meet the primary needs of those in surrounding areas with essential items such as nutritious food and clothing, while also including educational games, books and toys that encourage children to get outdoors and develop a greater love for learning.



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
